Create your own playlists of your favourite songs. Why not to pick 5 songs you all like and add them to your playlist, shuffle and have a home party?

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


#15 DIG OUT OLD PHOTOS AND ALBUMS


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GET CRAFTY

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


MAKE SOCK PUPPETS






MAKE JEWELLERY

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



